CB: You get lots of progression from it. I've come on a lot as a player because of the different opposition which forces you to improve.

CLQ: This is a great stepping stone for them. Getting 90 children playing regularly during the summer is brilliant. As a coach, week by week you can see the improvement the players are making as cricketers.
